CVUSD Dual Language Immersion Pathway

Dual Language Immersion is a unique educational model where children learn to think, read, write and communicate naturally in two languages: English and Spanish. Currently, our CVUSD Dual Language Immersion Pathway begins in kindergarten and continues through 12th grade, with the goal of promoting biliteracy, bilingualism, and biculturalism. One of the main objectives of this program is to develop comprehension and oral skills, reading and writing skills as well as academic content in both languages, and develop an appreciation for cultural diversity.

Elementary Program Model


80:20 – The first number '80' refers to the percentage of instructional time initially spent for instruction in the target language (Spanish) in Kindergarten. The second number '20' refers to the percentage of instructional time spent for instruction English. In our 80:20 model, the amount of the target language decreases yearly as English increases until there is a 50:50 balance of the languages in grades four through six.

Middle School Program Model

In middle school, students will have two classes in Spanish, Social Studies and a Spanish Language Arts elective, as well as their English coursework.

Pathway to the Seal of Biliteracy

At Coachella Valley Unified School District, we created a pathway for students to be recognized for their successful academic achievement in English and Spanish. Students who participate in our Dual Language Immersion Pathway will have the opportunity to obtain the Pathway to the Seal of Biliteracy Award. The intent of this award is to encourage students to continue their journey towards biliteracy as they progress through middle school and high school. Students who meet the Dual Language Pathway criteria will be granted the Pathway to the Seal of Biliteracy Award at the end of sixth grade.

State Seal of Biliteracy

The California State Seal of Biliteracy is awarded to graduating high school seniors who have demonstrated academic biliteracy in one or more languages other than English. Students who meet the state requirements will receive an official gold seal on their diploma and a notation in their transcripts. Representatives from the English Learner Department will also present recipients with Certificates of Achievement at the Senior Awards ceremonies held at each high school prior to graduation.
